The Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (H.R.4173) signed into U.S. law on 21 July 2010, requires the Securities and Exchange Commission to establish rules requiring disclosure and reporting procedures on the purchase and use of materials from conflict regions. Naprotek, Inc. is supportive of the efforts by the EICC of not utilizing raw materials from the Democratic Republic of the Congo and the adjoining countries and confirms that it has not, and will not knowingly supply any customers with such products.

Naprotek, Inc. is not a manufacturer of electronics parts and thus is not in a position to provide accurate information relating to the use of conflict minerals in the products it builds. The manufacturers of electronic components and products are the only source of accurate information regarding substances, including any conflict minerals, used in the manufacture of their products.

Naprotek Inc. understands the importance of this issue to you, our customer and is committed to the pursuit of responsible procurement practices. We have taken steps to back track our supply chain and are closely monitoring the status of conflict minerals with the full intent of complying with the legislation and supporting our customers when it becomes feasible to do so.

Governmental and non-governmental agencies are working in cooperation to address the concerns which have prevented companies from achieving the intent of the Conflict Minerals initiative. Naprotek Inc. will continue to implement due diligence and any necessary and required processes to facilitate compliance with this regulation.
